By God's grace from the 9th March to the 13th March 2011, we went to preach at the village where this young man had moved to and God graciously saved all the members of his household. We were meant to have open air preaching crusades that week but our plans were disrupted by heavy rainfalls which constantly poured in that area that week. We finally resorted to in-house evening services through the week and a dozen people from the neighbourhood joined us. We had about 11 new converts who joined us and eight of the eleven are coming to church. Isn't it amazing how God still saves people even in adverse situations?

The drunken man & his family:

One outstanding incident is how a young married man (Mr Katiyo) came to our last evening meeting totally drunk. That night we did not have anyone responding to an altar call for salvation but the drunken man felt this was his night to leave his sinful lifestyle. He went home, told his wife that he wanted to be saved. So come Sunday morning, the young man, his mum and his wife came to attend our church service and they gave their lives to Christ for the first time. To date they are some of our strongest members in Macheke right now.

Challenges in the field during the week

We faced all kinds of challenges during this week but the Lord saw us through. A team member from Rusape had a terrible fever infection and for two days she could not wake up but the Lord finally healed her and she sung in the last service like she had never been ill. My car mysteriously broke three alternator belts in the same week, twice had tyre puncture owing to rough roads but in all these incidents we did not give in.
